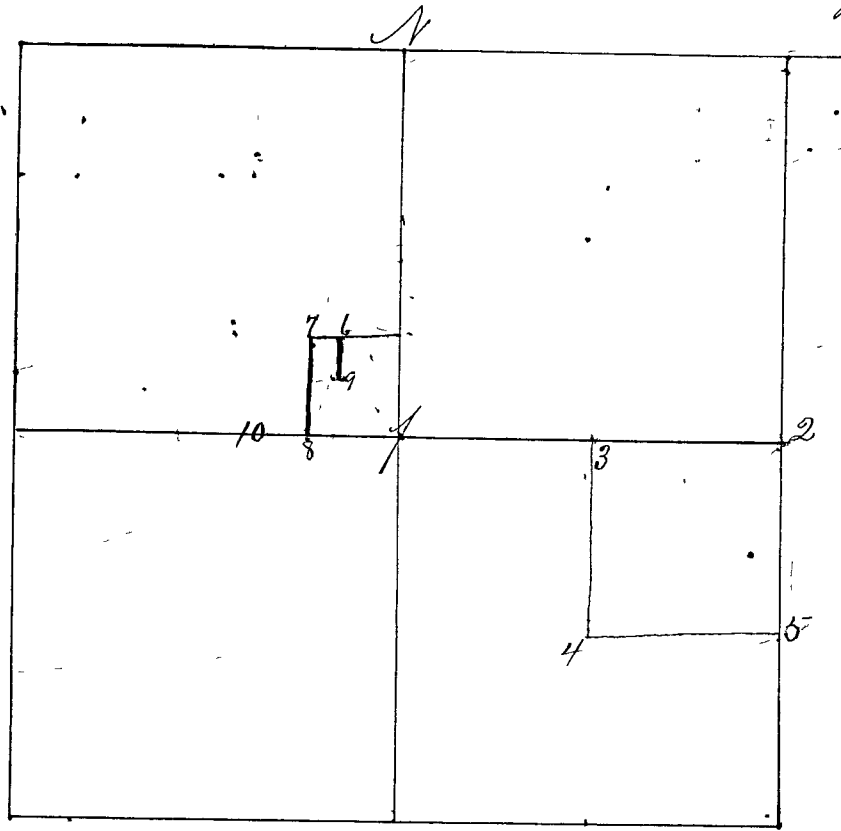


I, Hon Werron, Deputy County Surveyor of Clay County Ia. Being called upon by J. A. Modesitt, attended on the ground on Thursday the 18th of Feb. 1858. and all the Parties being present to-wit; John Eppert, Peter Eppert, George Carpenter, & J. A. Modesitt, and at their request and consent, and evidence continued the perpetuation of said center corner, of said section No. 7, in accordance with and agreeable to a former survey of G. C. Modesitt Dept. County Surveyor by setting a Sand Stone 2 ft long as the corner, and taking new witness trees as the former trees taken by Modesitt were down and part decayed Witness trees taken at 6.°W variation, and glass under stone,
