

Corner No. 6 A Blue Lime Stone Mr. B. with broken glass under stone. - among the glass is the neck of a wine bottle, said stone is set Ten and five hundredth (10.05) chains North and Six and twenty one and ~~two~~ fourth hundredth. (6.21 $\frac{3}{4}$) chains West of the South East corner of the North West quarter of the section, being at the south side of the South East alley in the town of Cloverland.

Corner No. 7 A "Nigger head" Stone 17 inches long; before the stone was set a hole 3 ft. and 3 inches deep and 7 and $\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter was filled with potter's ware broken in small pieces and the corner stone was placed thereon, said nigger head stone is One and fifty three and one fourth hundredth (1.53 $\frac{3}{4}$) chains West from corner number 6 above located at south side gate.

Corner No. 8 A Piece of casting belonging to the front plate of the furnace of the old Cloverland Grist mill, with a hole 3 feet deep and 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter filled with potter's ware under the ^{casting} stone. Said corner is Thirty one (31) Rods West from the south east corner of the N. W. qr. of the section on the $\frac{1}{2}$ mile line.

Corner No. 9 A "Nigger head" stone (not marked) set Two hundred and forty (240) feet south from corner No. 6 as shown on the plat on the preceding page and in line with a point 6.21 $\frac{3}{4}$ chains West of the center of section.

Corner No. 10. A "Nigger head" stone 27 inches long with crockery under stone; said stone set on the $\frac{1}{2}$ mile line 11.23 chains West of the center ~~West~~ of the
